


From the Chair



With another year drawing to a close, I reflect on the work that Operation Cleft has done for the children in Bangladesh. To date, our surgeons have completed more than 8,250 operations of which almost 40% are considered complex surgery. I am inspired by the fact that these children's lives have changed forever due to our commitment and the skills of our surgeons. I admire the courage of the parents who present their children for surgery despite their fear of

hospitals and anesthetics due largely to ignorance and superstition. I am encouraged by the generosity of so many individuals, businesses and clubs in Australia and overseas, who share our passion for helping these poor children to have a life of dignity and hope. To all who support this unique project I say a heartfelt thank you.

Exciting times are ahead for Operation Cleft. Two Rotary clubs have partnered with their Districts to sponsor surgical outreach programs. In October the Rotary Club of Essendon, joined with District 9800 to sponsor a surgical camp led by Professor Bari at the Shaheed Zia Medical College & Hospital in Bogra. The second camp, sponsored by the Rotary Club of Box Hill Central and District 9810, is scheduled for late November and will be led by Assoc. Professor Ali. It will be held at the Khulna Medical College Hospital and it is expected that as a result of these two camps, around sixty children will be given a "Smile for Life".

Our General Manager, Julie Stein and the incoming Chairman will travel with me to Bangladesh in February for contract renegotiation with our surgeons and in-country partner, CDD {Centre for Disability in Development}. We will take the opportunity to speak at several Rotary clubs and catch up with project Patron, Asif Moyeen and local Ambassador, Faiyaz Khan. A group of Rotarians holidaying in Bangladesh and India will link up with us during their tour. They are very excited about visiting a surgical camp in Dhaka where they will experience the tensions and joys of Operation Cleft as they mingle with surgeons, patients and parents.



Currently consideration is being given to supporting efforts to increase the number of qualified plastic surgeons in Bangladesh.


At present there is a ratio of one plastic surgeon to almost ten million people; an impossible workload. We will be meeting with senior surgeons and the Society of Plastic Surgeons when we are there to discuss how we can assist. If ever Bangladesh is to be self-supporting in the treatment of clefts, burns, and other important surgical requirements then the number of skilled plastic surgeons must increase significantly and there must be wider distribution across the country rather than accepting the current concentration of surgeons in the capital, Dhaka. Our ultimate aim is that all children who need their services have ready access to the skills of well qualified Bangladeshi plastic surgeons."



This year, the Management Committee of the Operation Cleft Australia Foundation Trust has undergone some changes. Two members, Jenny Hamley and Sandy Kemp have retired and three new members have been appointed. Bruce McEwen, Vici Funnell and Richard Lim were nominated and subsequently welcomed on to the committee. Bruce is the current President of the Rotary Club of Box Hill Central. Vici brings considerable experience in health services administration and Richard is an accountant in the not for profit sector.

The other major change is that at the end of October, I will stand down as Chairman. I have enjoyed my work with the project immensely over the past three and a half years, It has been greatly encouraging to meet so many people - our surgeons, supporters, donors and Rotary Clubs and their members and to recognise their interest and concern for the children we are helping in far off Bangladesh. It has been a privilege and pleasure to lead Operation Cleft as it continues in it's life changing work."

Thank you for your support throughout 2013. It has been a year of significant activity and our patients and their families have truly benefitted from your generosity.

Without intervention and support, these people are ostracized and excluded from mainstream life. CDD's mission is to educate the broader community, whilst providing support services to enable an integrated and inclusive society. Operation Cleft is one of 350 national and international organisations who, in partnership with CDD, work towards giving all people in Bangladesh an opportunity to reach their full potential.

Executive Director, A.H.M. Noman Khan, had the honour of being awarded the international Ramon Magsaysay Award in recognition of his pioneering leadership and dedication to building a society that is truly inclusive.

Early next year, Operation Cleft Australia will renegotiate a further three year partnership agreement with CDD that will incorporate our strategic plan for ensuring future growth and long term sustainability of Operation Cleft as a service to disadvantaged children born with a cleft lip or plate in Bangladesh.

A stitch in time

Since Operation Cleft began, our surgical team have completed more than 8,250 operations. 60% of our patients present with complex bi-lateral cleft lips and cleft palates. Rashed pictured below fortunately did not have a cleft palate but still required multiple operations to correct his bi-lateral cleft lip and prolabial protrusion. (Where the central soft tissue segment of the upper lip protrudes.)



In March 2012 Rashed, then just 18 months old was assessed by one of our team. Although his palate was intact, due to the width of the cleft and a severe prolabial protrusion, surgeons decided that he would need multiple procedures to achieve the best outcome. Assessment completed, Rashed was scheduled for surgery where he had a bilateral lip adhesion. He was rescheduled for the definitive repair a few months later. Unfortunately after returning to his village in Panchagarh, Rashed dislodged the stitches on the right side of his lip and again underwent surgery to repair the initial procedure.

Three months later, after the tissue had stretched and the prolabium had set back some, Rashed finally had the definitive repair. Although the post surgery photo of Rashed (right) is not one of a happy little fellow, the surgery really did transform this little boy. He went from being a social outcast with an ugly facial deformity to a happy little two year old loved and accepted by everyone in his village.

Seasons greetings (in Bangladeshi)


